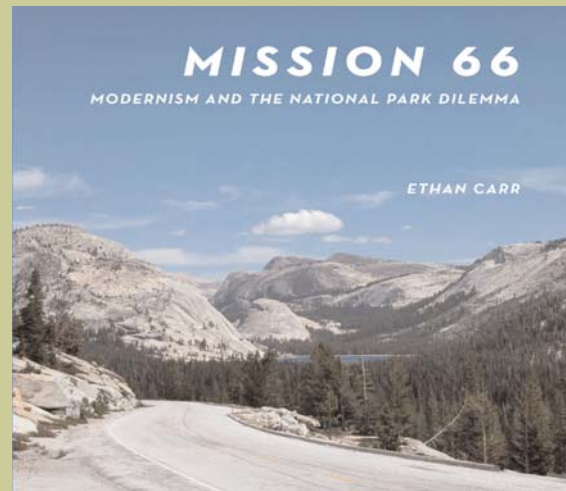

As the National Park Service embarks upon an ambitious initiative leading up to its centennial in 2016, we look back on its last major campaign, Mission 66, a billion-dollar program that added new parks, seashores, and recreation areas to the system leading up to its 50th anniversary in 1966. Controversial in its day, Mission 66 hastened the development of the modern environmental movement that gave birth to Earth Day, the EPA, and many organizations which now are familiar to everyone.

Ethan Carr, landscape historian, Associate Professor of Landscape Architecture at the University of Virginia, Charlottesville, and author of *Mission 66: Modernism and the National Park Dilemma*, will address this subject and its connection to Brookline's two National Park Sites.
